## Project Profile: Andersen Eye Associates Addition

Pumford Construction is currently building a 27,000 square foot addition on to the Andersen Eye Associates Surgery Center, located in Saginaw. The new addition will be an ophthalmology medical clinic which will house roughly a dozen ophthalmologists, two optometrists and one doctor of audiology and is expected to accommodate between 50,000 and 60,000 patient visits per year.

Pumford Construction is serving as both the designer and general contractor for this project. Pumford was also the general contractor back in 2006 when the surgery center was built.

Construction progress can be seen while driving down Tittabawassee Rd. between Mackinaw Rd. and Center Rd. The project is expected to be complete in the spring of 2011.
